

SENIOR YEAR TIMELINE



SEPTEMBER

- Make a list of test names, fees, deadlines, and deadlines for college admissions and financial aid applications.
- Register for SAT/ACT if you plan to attend a 4 year college. Check college requirements.
 - SAT/ACT not required for UC and CSU applicants
- Attend Fall college rep visits at Vanden
- Review CSU/UC majors
- Begin applying for Scholarships
 - o C heck the Scholarship Bulleting frequently for updates
- Prepare your resume for teachers and your counselor, used for letters of recommendation

OCTOBER

- Register/Take the SAT/ACT if needed
- Work on admissions application essays.
- Visit your top school choices.
 - o Interview some students, faculty and staff if possible.
- Find out which financial aid applications your college choices require and when the forms are due. Some private universities may require that you register for CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE.
- CSU application filing period begins October 1st. Begin preparing your college applications.
- Attend an application workshop with counselors for assistance at lunch.
 - Weekly bulletin announcements and reminders

NOVEMBER

- Take the SAT/ACT exam if necessary.
- UC application filing period open November 1-30.
- Complete college applications.
 - Most applications due by November 30

DECEMBER/JANUARY

- FAFSA scheduled to open December 2023
 - Work with your parents or guardians to fill out your
 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by
 March 2
- Continue Scholarship search



SENIOR YEAR TIMELINE



FEBRUARY

- Complete your FAFSA if you have not already done so.
- Apply to an Assist-A-Grad scholarship! Have your personal essay, resume and letters of recommendation prepared.

MARCH

- Complete FAFSA by March 2 for priority deadline
- Look for your Student Aid Report (SAR) in the mail. Your SAR contains federal financial aid information.
- Attending a Community College? Start the application process and schedule an appointment with a community college counselor.

APRIL

- Watch the mail for acceptance letters and financial aid award letters.
- Compare the financial aid awards you receive.
- Choose a school and send in a deposit before the deadline.
- Check with the college you've chosen about the details of signing and returning financial aid award letters.
- Notify the other schools that you will not be attending.
- Watch for important deadlines (housing, financial aid, etc.) at your chosen college.

MAY/JUNE

- Prepare for your AP exams and complete your AP tests
- Cross everything off your graduation checklist
- Work hard on your Senior Finals
- GRADUATE

**Final high school transcripts will be sent to the college/tech school of your destination in mid June. Please make sure you make an official request through Parchment on the Vanden website.

**You must also send your AP scores to your college destination.
