2) New Course Proposal – Introduction to Ethnic Studies	Discussed details of this new course proposal and answered questions. Entry level course with no prerequisites. Recommended prerequisite for Advanced Topics in Ethnic Studies.	This course would be taught by a single subject Social Science credentialed teacher. It is possible that it could be taught by any teacher with a single subject credential.
